BREAKING NEWS! STUDY FINDS FOSSIL FUEL COMPANIES TO BLAME FOR INFLATION



According to a new study, oil and gas companies raised their prices around the time of Russia's invasion of Ukraine in early 2022 based on assumptions the war would disrupt fossil fuel supplies. While this shortage didn't actually materialize, higher price-tags cost Canadians \$12,000
